



Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?

Children see a variety of animals, each one a different color, and a teacher looking at them.




Bunny Party by Rosemary Wells

Max and his big sister Ruby disagree about which of their toys to invite to Grandma's birthday party.




Chicka, Chicka, Boom, Boom by Bill Martin Jr.

An alphabet rhyme/chant that relates what happens when the whole alphabet tries to climb a coconut tree.




Color Zoo by Lois Ehlert


Introduces colors and shapes with illustrations of shapes on die-cut pages that form animal faces when placed on top of one another.




Cool Dog, School Dog by Deborah Heiligman
When Tinka the dog follows her owner to school and creates havoc, the children discover a way to let her stay in the classroom and help.




***Freight Train** by Donald Crews
Brief text and illustrations trace the journey of a colorful train as it goes through tunnels, by cities, and over trestles.




Goodnight Moon by Margaret Wise Brown

A young African-American girl describes the different, wonderful ways she can wear her hair.




I Wish That I Had Duck Feet by Theo LeSieg

Is Your Mama A Llama? by Deborah Guarino


A young llama asks his friends if their mamas are llamas and finds out, in rhyme, that their mothers are other types of animals.


Even though Henry is looking forward to going to kindergarten, he is not sure about staying once he first gets there.



Miss Bindergarten Gets Ready for Kindergarten



This book introduces the letters of the alphabet as Miss Bindergarten and her students get ready for kindergarten.




My Five Senses by Margaret Miller

Text and accompanying photographs present a simple introduction to the five senses and how they help us experience the world around us.




The Little Red Hen by Byron Barton

The little red hen finds none of her lazy friends willing to help her plant, harvest, or grind wheat into flour, but all are eager to eat the bread she makes from it.




***The Neighborhood Mother Goose**

A collection of nursery rhymes, both familiar and lesser known, illustrated with photographs in a city setting.




The Very Quiet Cricket by Eric Carle

A very quiet cricket who wants to rub his wings together and make a sound as do so many other animals finally achieves his wish.




Time for Bed by Mem Fox

As darkness falls, animal and human parents everywhere try to get their children ready for sleep.




We're Going on a Bear Hunt by Michael Rosen

A four year old describes how she has changed since she was a baby.




Yes Day! by Amy Krouse Rosenthal
