Nic Bishop's signature up-close, stop-action photographs show spiders larger than life.




No Talking by Andrew Clements

The noisy fifth grade boys of Laketon Elementary School challenge the equally loud fifth grade girls to a "no talking" contest.




Rescue on the Oregon Trail by Kate Messner


Tucky Jo and Little Heart by Patricia Polacco


A Light in the Attic by Shel Silverstein


Amazing Americans (series) by Mary Dodson Wade

This series looks at the life and accomplishments of famous Americans. Books include bibliographical references and an index.




The Babe and I by David A. Adler

While helping his family make ends meet during the Depression by selling newspapers, a boy meets Babe Ruth.




Cam Jansen (series) by David Adler
